Since the annual letter went out in February, the world has been shaken by the Covid-19 pandemic. First and foremost, we all hope that you and your loved ones have been safe.

As you can imagine, the pandemic has thrown the entire museum world and all exhibition schedules into chaos. In the February letter, plans were announced for Fitzgerald exhibitions in 2021 on both coasts. These plans have needed to be modified. The exhibition of Fitzgerald's California work to be held at the Monterey Museum of Art has been postponed until early 2022. Similarly, the summer exhibition at the Monhegan Museum of his Monhegan work has been postponed to the 2022 season.

Due to the inherent difficulties involved with maintaining social distance in such a confined space as the Kent-Fitzgerald buildings, Fitzgerald studio hours are not being held this summer for the first time since the Fitzgerald estate was gifted to the museum in 2003.

We are hopeful that the season will not be entirely lost, however, as we all recognize the importance of the arts in our lives, now more than ever. The Monhegan Museum is following closely the advice of health officials at the Maine CDC to enact whatever measures we can to help ensure the safety of our staff and visitors.
